## **Air Conditioning**

Our school recently applied for a Cooler Classrooms grant to air condition our classrooms. I have today been informed that our grant application has been successful to partially fund this very important project. Our P&C have kindly agreed to contribute funds and the school will cover the balance of the costs to ensure that we can successfully air condition every classroom across the school.

## **Fortnite**

I am becoming increasingly concerned about the growing interest in the game craze of the moment, Fortnite. Mrs Canute recently published a note home to parents to inform of the impact this game is having on some of our students, most commonly in stage three. The basic premise of Fortnite is to kill to survive, using high-powered automatic assault weapons. Players can play in teams and connect via chat as they play.

This capacity for chat mode has made Fortnite a main vehicle for online communication for many students in Stage 3, in particular, boys, who are playing this "kill to survive" game in teams with their school peers, then coming to school and continuing their discussions.

The game is rated as suitable for players over the age of 12. Each family has their own set of boundaries and opinions about what is appropriate for their children. If your child is playing Fortnite at home, I would encourage you to educate yourself about the game. The most important thing to be wary of is that there is an opportunity for your children to connect with strangers in the game, and there is minimal monitoring of who is online and what is being said in the chat. I encourage you raise your awareness at home of the impact that this game may have on your children. Regards
