Dear Parents,

Technology for Learning(

The school recently received our Technology for Learning (T4L) annual rollout replacing 36 desktop computers within classrooms across the school. I would to acknowledge and thank Adam Tudor, Paul Matthews and Jenny Henderson for the quick installation and ongoing support with technology in their roles as our school computer coordinators.

Selective High School Test

The 2020 Selective High School Test process will be available to students in Year 5 choosing to apply online for a Selective High School placement in 2020. Information regarding this process is available at the school office.

Compulsory School Attendance in NSW Schools

Under the Education Act (1990) all children from 6 years to 17 years of age are legally required to attend school every day. Recent changes to attendance requirements place obligations on schools to more closely monitor attendance and to take appropriate action if students are either not attending or are absent for reasons not justified by the school. We value good attendance from all students. Regular attendance is important because it helps your child:

- Maximise their learning opportunities
- Develop the skills needed to access the world of work and other opportunities
- To learn the importance of punctuality
- Maintain healthy social relationships with their friends
- Develop a good working relationship with their teachers

Unfortunately habits of non-attendance tend to develop quickly, and it is concerning that if a child misses just 8 days a term, they would miss more than one year of schooling by the end of primary school which then presents problems as they begin high school.

The law requires that if your child is absent from school, you must inform the school as soon as possible and provide a legitimate reason for your child's absence. This can be done by:

- Sending a note on your child's return to school
- · Contacting through the school email
- Informing via the Skoolbag app
- Visiting the school
- Calling the school

Your child's education is important. Please contact the school if there are problems in getting your children to school or if there are concerns you have about them at school. A positive partnership between home and school in this area is of great value to the school but most importantly to the success and quality of your child's education. Regards

Applying for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2020 including Aurora College at Bowral High

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 14 March 2019**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, including Aurora College at Bowral High (see below), you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's school email address). Detailed instructions on how to apply online are available at

https:// education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website at that link will close on 12 November 2018. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance. You must submit only **ONE** application for each student.

Aurora College (The Virtual Secondary School) is a new and unique secondary option for students in government schools in NSW. It has formed a partnership with Bowral High School to provide a genuine Selective School experience to the Southern Highlands.

Students stay connected locally while developing their passion for subjects and courses that link to their career plans and broaden their post school options. Students connect with their peers and their teachers through lessons delivered virtually, through technology and in person during residential schools held twice each year. Aurora College has a strong science and mathematics focus. Mentoring opportunities and master classes are key features of the learning experience.

Aims

Aurora College allows gifted and talented students to remain in their local school and community while studying with a peer group of students of similar academic ability and interest. Students connect with their teachers and classmates through a virtual learning environment, which includes web conferencing software and the Department's virtual classrooms. Where possible, lessons are recorded so that students can access lessons at other times.

Aurora@Bowral High School

Bowral High has made adjustments to its timetable so that during Maths, Science and English periods, Aurora students attend online lessons from their Aurora College Teachers. A small private facility at the back of the Library has been organised as the Aurora College classroom with the necessary technology for Aurora students to access. Students will be supported by an Aurora Coordinator at Bowral High School. Bowral High also has an Aurora College maths teacher on its staff for additional support.

During the rest of the school day, Aurora students will circulate with the Academic or STEM classes so that they can develop a wider group of friends and participate in normal school life such as science practical classes, PE and Sports, History/Geography, Visual Arts and Music, Japanese, Food Technology and Industrial Arts. They also can participate in school drama performances, school band, CHS Sports, Swimming Carnivals and Athletics Carnivals.

Mentoring Program

Mentoring is a key feature of the learning experiences available to students at Aurora College through our virtual learning environments. Mentoring sessions take place during school hours under teacher supervision. To be eligible for enrolment in our school, students must be enrolled in a NSW Government school which is classified as a rural school. Applications for entry into Year 7 in 2020 open on 9 October 2018 and close on 12 November 2018. The Selective High School Placement Test for entry to Year 7 in 2020 will be held on Thursday 14 March 2019.
